
CRYSTAL CATHEDRAL — CHRIST CATHEDRAL: A CONVERSION STORY

We have all heard about the major renovation happening in the Diocese of Orange County. It began with the purchase of the Crystal Cathedral back in 2012. It is believed to be the first ever Protestant church converted to a Catholic place of worship. Once underway, progress was quickly made. This <u>article</u> has a youtube video with it that shows the progress made in a year. It's important to understand that this new Christ Cathedral serves thousands of families and offers 12 masses on the weekend alone. Its completion is much anticipated after 7 long years of renovations to all the buildings on the campus. In June of 2018, Bishop Keith Vann declared a Year of Preparation for the area Catholics to observe. This year, leading up to the July 2019 dedication, is a year of grace and blessing set aside for spiritual reflection not unlike Advent or Lent. <u>Click here</u> to read more about the year-long celebration.


