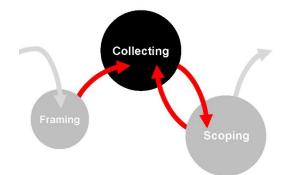




Would you say that the existing facilities *help*, have *no effect*, or *hinder* you in effecting your mission?





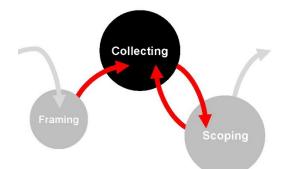




If your congregation were a piece of music, which of the following would you most want it to be?

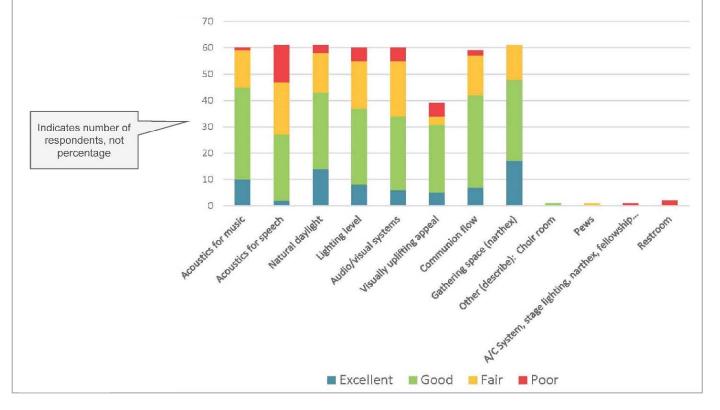




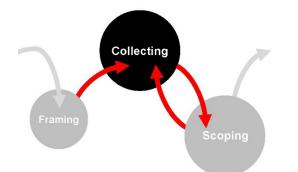




How would you assess the quality of your existing worship space with respect to each of the following?



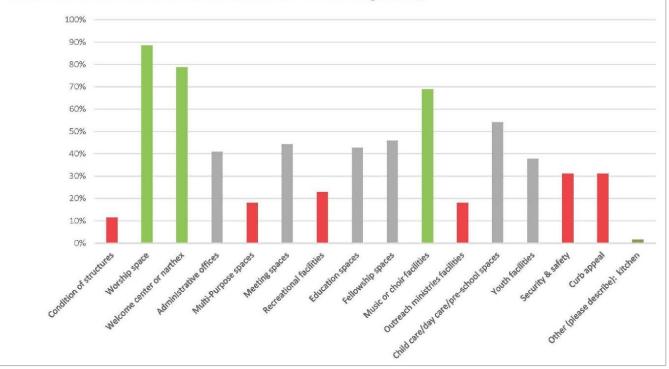


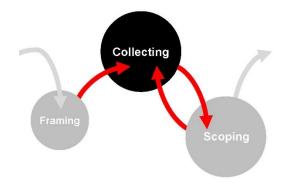




In general, what is the adequacy of the following facilities at this time?

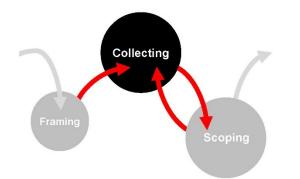

Which type of **Architectural** character would you prefer in a multi-use space that is used for worship?



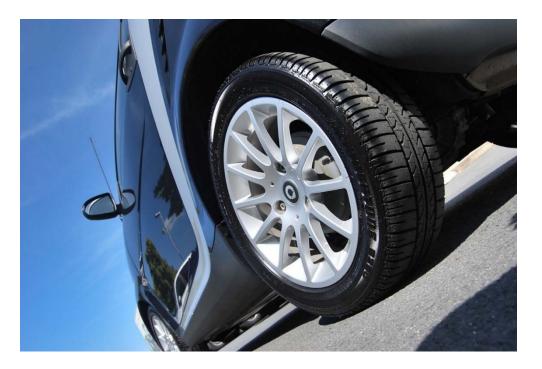

SUMMARY OF PROGRAM STATEMENT

Phase One Project:

Worship space:

- Church: A new 800 seat worship space will be provided, to be constructed on the site of the
 existing one, which will be demolished. Sacristy, ushers room, brides' room, cry room, art &
 environment and liturgy storage room, and other support facilities will be included. Modern
 facilities for A/V and sound systems will be incorporated.
 - Size: 12,000 square feet (gross floor area)
 - Initial Budget: \$4.55 million (includes construction, Owner-provided equipment, and soft costs)
- Narthex: Together with the new Church, the existing Narthex will be significantly expanded, to
 roughly double its existing size. Hospitality features will be included, and ancillary facilities
 (toilets, etc.) will be expanded to meet codes, and upgraded.
 - Size: 4,600 square feet (2,500 SF existing and 2,100 SF new)
 - Initial Budget: \$1.15 million (includes construction, Owner-provided equipment, and soft costs)
- Choir Rehearsal Space: As part of the new Church, a music ministry space will also be included, with direct connection to the new Church. Capacity for the choir rehearsal room will be 60 persons, with terraced seating. Acoustics will be designed to replicate the Church. Music and instrument storage, and a music minister's office are also included.
 - Size: 2,400 square feet
 - Initial Budget: \$750 thousand (includes construction, Owner-provided equipment, and soft costs)

Fellowship space:

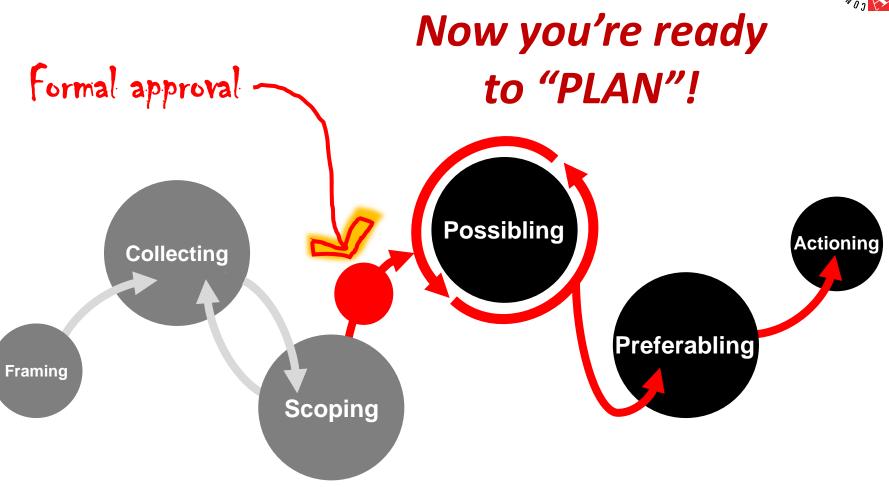
- Kitchen: The existing kitchen shall be expanded to provide adequate "commercial" food service facilities. This expansion will be accomplished either by adding on to the existing Family Life Center, or the existing Adult Meeting Room will be converted to kitchen usage. All new food service equipment will be aobtained.
 - Size: 1,700 square feet
 - Initial Budget: \$685 thousand (includes construction, Owner-provided equipment, and soft costs)

Youth space: no change to existing.

Education space: no change to existing at this time. While there are additional space needs at this time, they can be accommodated by using other existing facilities.

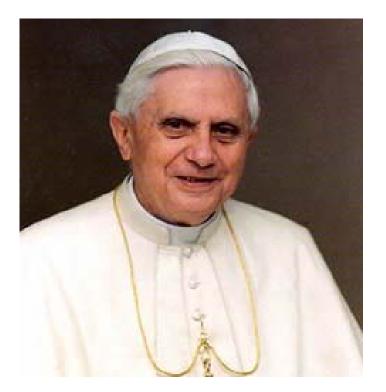




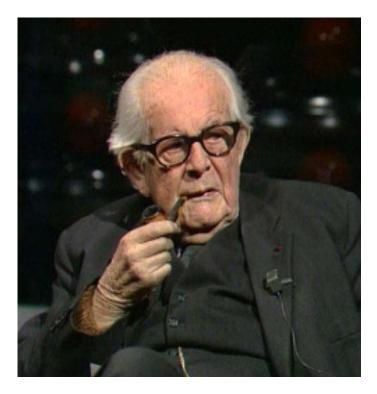
